2017 Budget

NEW BUSINESS

2017 Coffee House

The Deputy Clerk informs the Members that the 2017 Coffee House has been scheduled for Friday, May 5, 2017, from 7:00 pm to 10:00 pm. The Committee discusses styling the event as a coffee house and requests Administration to contact l'Essor to determine if a small stage can be erected on the auditorium floor. The Tecumseh Area Historical Society is confirmed for the event and will once again be supplying pop, water and popcorn.

The Members review the application form and request that it be made available to residents.

TAHS Feather Project

The Committee is advised that funds remain in the budget for the Feather Project.

Canada 150 - Mosaic Project

The Deputy Clerk advises that the Town has been approached to participate in the Canada 150 Mosaic Project. The purpose of the project is to create a mural including all provinces and territories, with over 80,000 paintings and 150 individual murals that when united will form one gigantic mural mosaic. The mural, if ever connected would be over 365 meters wide (4 football fields) x 2.5 meters high (8 feet).

For this project, 400-750 tiles will be given to the Town for painting. The Canada 150 Mosaic team of artists and facilitators will come and work with members of the community to create an ultimate two-day painting event. Any skill level and age are welcome. Every tile painted will be 4 inches x 4 inches in size, creating a unified community mural.

Upon the completion of the mural, it will reside in the town or city where it was created as a reminder of the 150th anniversary, and the pride of the community and the nation.

The Committee, along with the Youth and Senior Advisory Committees, is asked to advise and participate in this event should it be approved by Council.

NOVEMBER 2016 ISSUE

Preliminary Research Results Highlight Record Successes

A host of valuable feedback from public participants and activity organizers has been flowing in steadily following the record-breaking 7th annual Culture Days event that took place this past Sept. 30, Oct. 1 & 2. Culture Days commissions annual national independent research* with both groups to help gauge its impact; and the preliminary findings are encouraging. As Culture Days matures, its role in helping artists, creators and cultural groups work together to reach new audiences and affirm their role in their communities is increasingly apparent. Further, Culture Days continues to open new avenues for the public to explore and discover the cultural life of their neighbourhoods and communities.

Here are a few excerpts of the independent research:

Culture Days Participants:

- 82% of attendees said they were very satisfied with the Culture Days activities that they participated in, up from 79% in 2015 and 75% in 2014
- 74% of attendees said they would recommend others to attend Culture Days, a significant increase from 2015
- 61% said that because of their previous participation in Culture Days, they attended more arts and cultural events throughout the year; up from 54% last year

Culture Days Activity Organizers:

- 86% said their activity was successful and 46% very successful, up from 38% in 2015
- 93% said that free Culture Days tools and resources were useful in promoting their activities, up from 90% last year
- 70% report that their past participation in Culture Days led to increased public interest in their work, and 66% said it led to their own increased enthusiasm for
