E. New Business

1. Essex County OPP Application for Mobile Crisis Response Team (MCRT) Enhancement Grant for 2021-22 to 2022-23

Essex County Constable Blake Cohoe explained that in addition to its Mental Health Response Unit the Essex County OPP has two teams - the Mobile Crisis Response Team (MCRT) and Youth Crisis Response Team (YCRT) - that became operational in April 2019 as the result of a grant from the Ministry of the Solicitor General (SolGen). Each team consists of a uniformed officer and social worker who respond to calls for service related to mental health and addictions. These teams will continue to be operational after the initial grant funding ends in March 2022.

The Essex County OPP is seeking the board's support for a new application for a Mobile Crisis Response Team Enhancement Grant in the form of a board motion and chair's signature on the application. This funding would pay for the salary, training and equipment for one part time crisis worker to be available to the MCRT seven days a week. (SolGen funding cannot be used for police expenses.)

The Town of Kingsville has offered to continue administration of the grant, as they have for the initial round of funding.

PC Cohoe noted that the MCRT has successfully diverted 65% of calls received away from hospital emergency rooms and/or the criminal justice system. The addition of a part time crisis worker will further support the team's efforts to provide effective mental health assistance to the community.
