	Since legalization in 2018, the licensed cannabis market has grown steadily, but has not eliminated illegal production in Canada. Without any of the oversight or protective measures created to regulate and prevent potentially harmful chemical and microbiological exposures, unregulated cannabis producers continue to supply thousands of Canadians with illegal and harmful products. In this session the Ontario Provincial Police will talk about their recent projects looking at illegal cannabis products and the harmful contaminants. Rachel will also discuss the need for broader collaboration between regulators, law enforcement and public health when communicating with Canadians about the potential risks of illegal cannabis.
