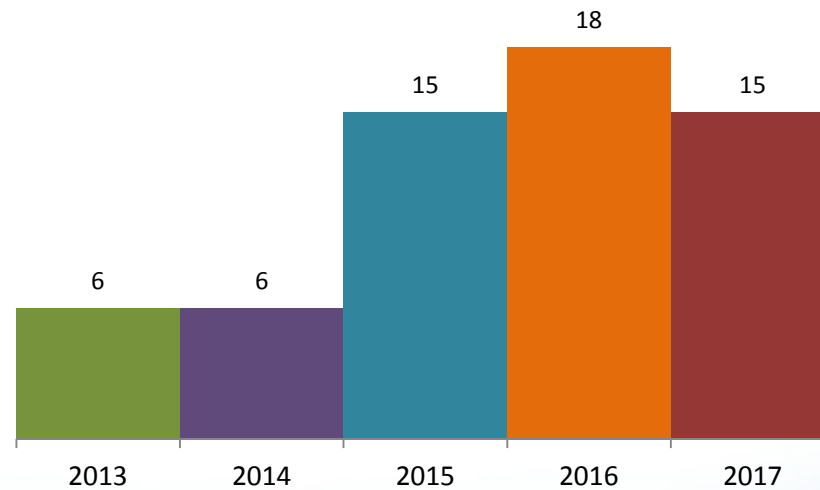

 - Seatbelts

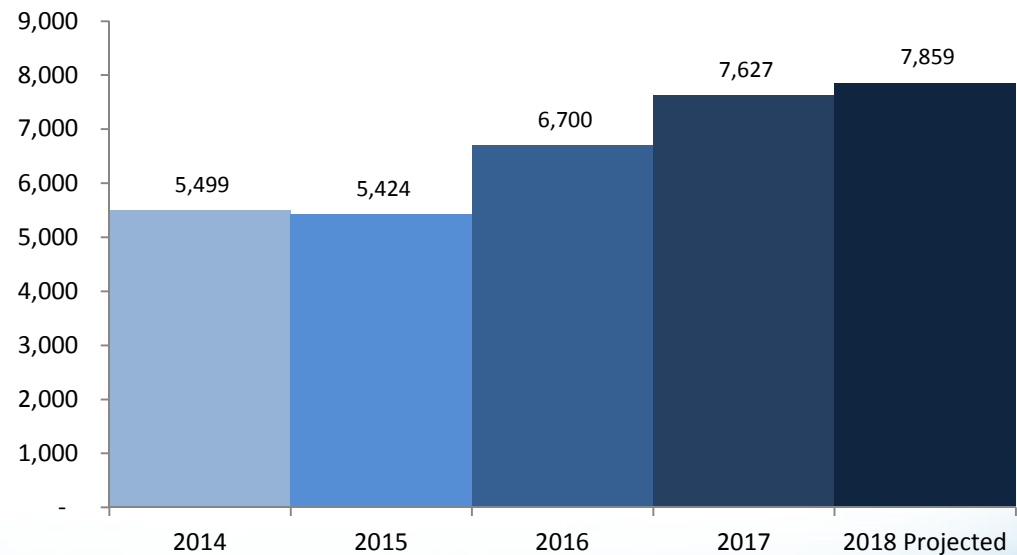

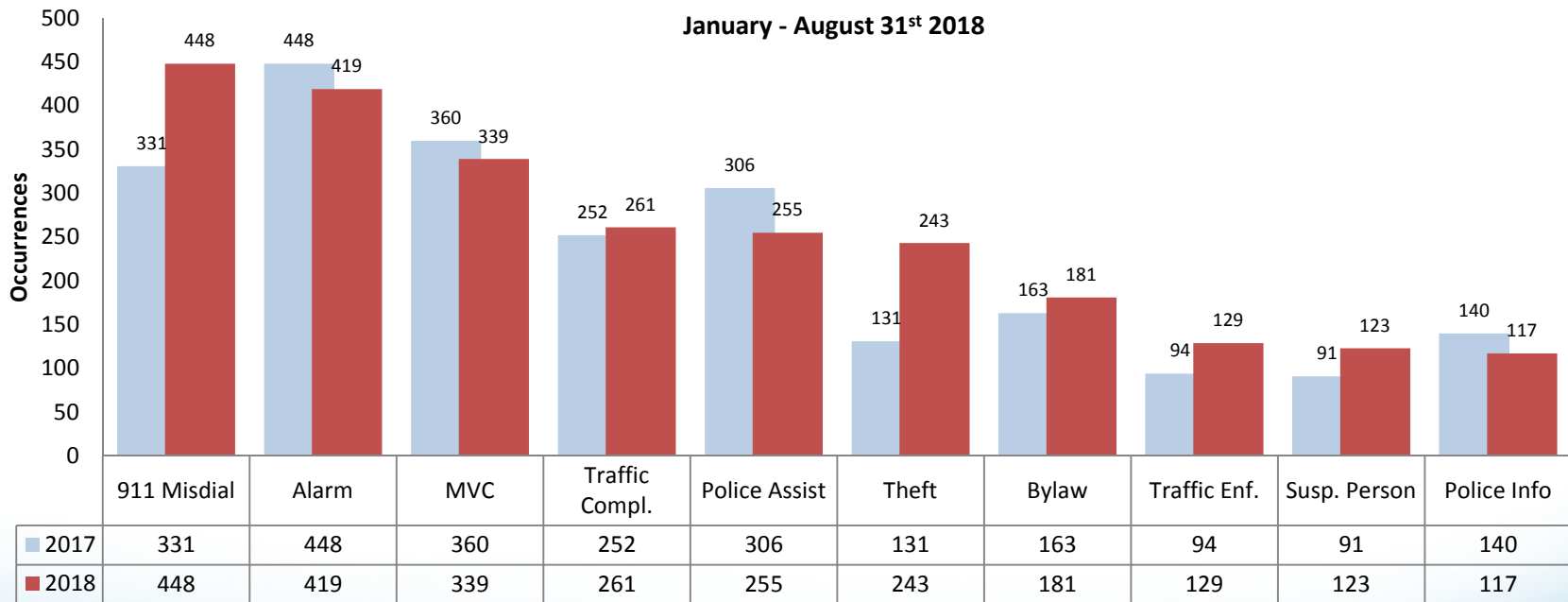

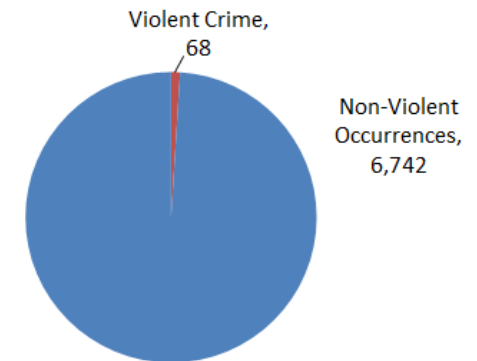

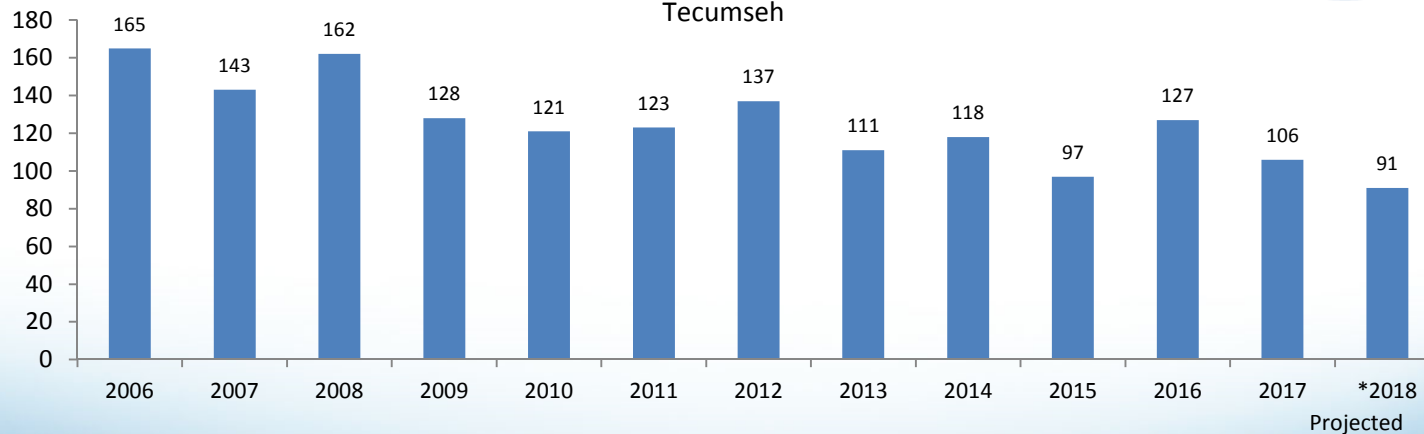
Violent Crime

- **16.5% decrease** in Violent Crime (2017/16) for Tecumseh
 - 7.11% increase Provincially (2017/16)
- Projected 14.5% decrease in Violent Crime (2018/17)
- Violent Crime Clearance Rates:
 - Provincial: 62.64% (2017)
 - **Tecumseh: 83.6%** (2017)

Tecumseh



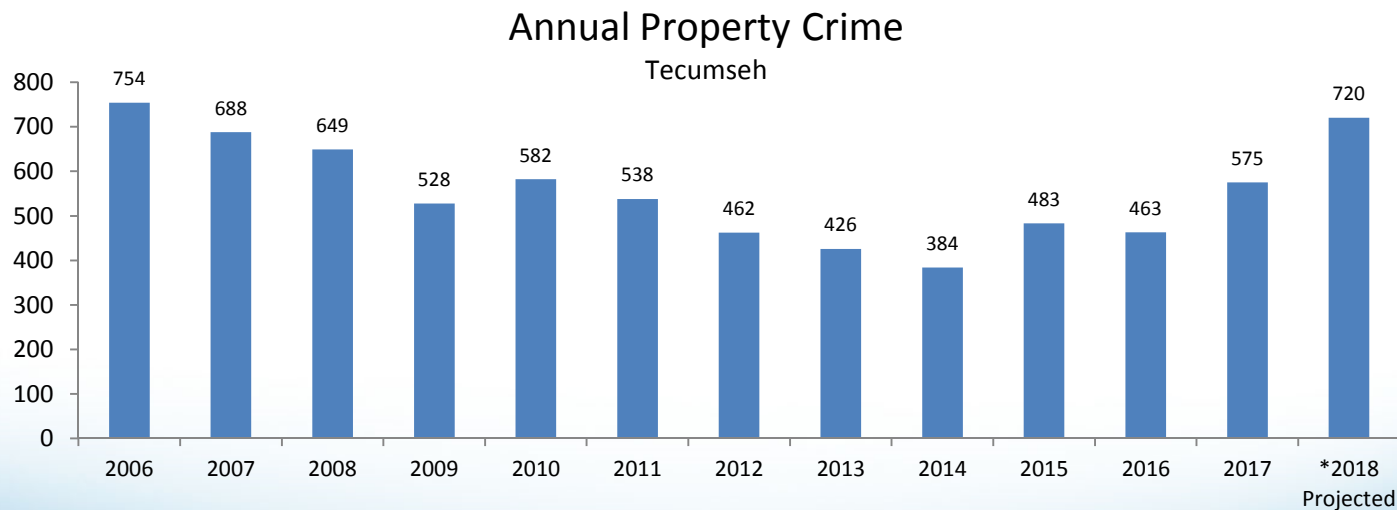

- **24.2% increase** in Property Crime (2017/16) in Tecumseh
- Project 25.2% increase in Property Crime (2018/17)
- Clearance rate: 20%

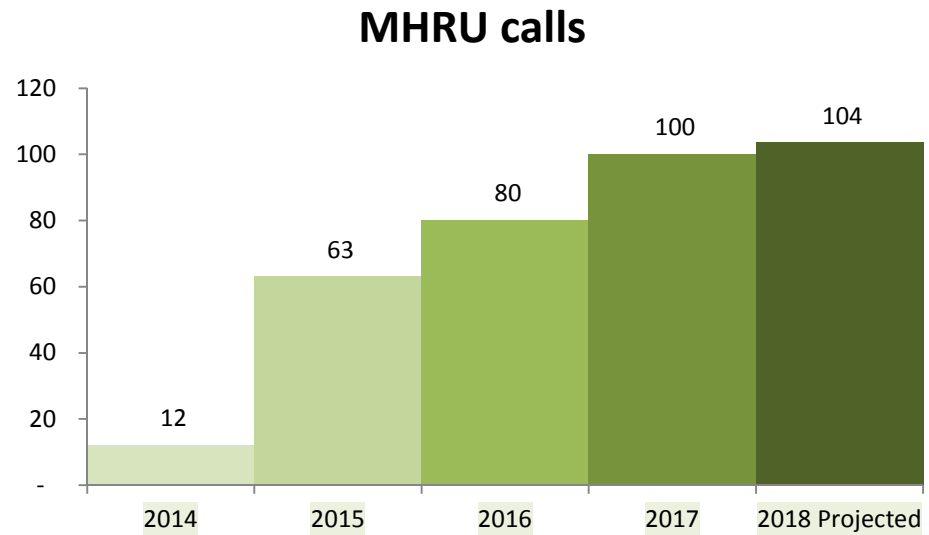

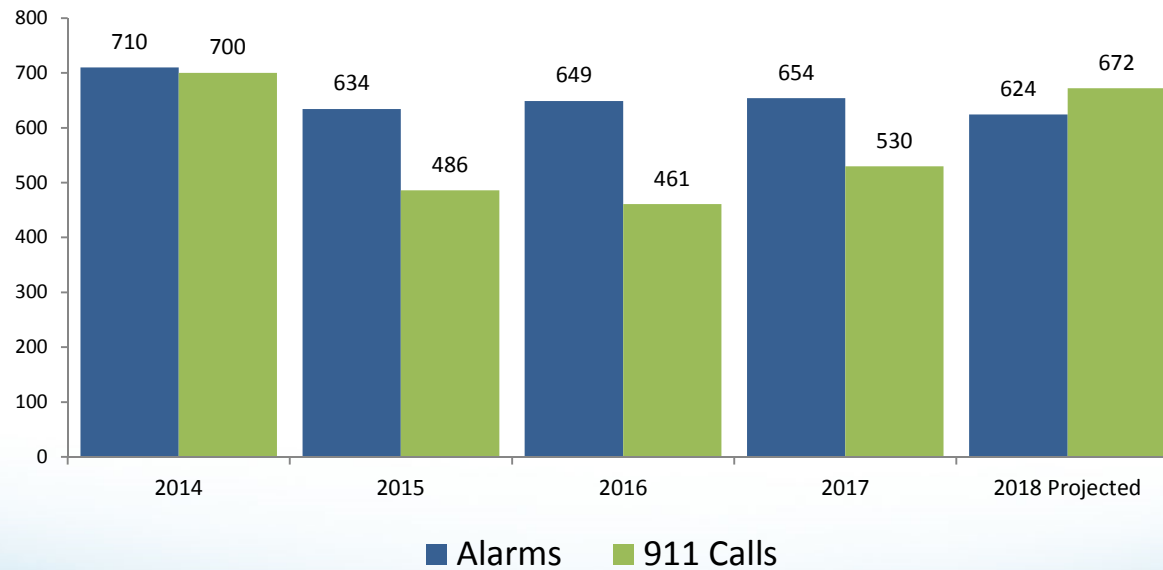

Legalization of Marihuana



- **Federal Cannabis Act**
 - Legal framework to control production, distribution, sale and possession
- **Ontario Cannabis Act**
 - To only be sold online by Ontario Cannabis Store until private retail established
 - 19+ years to purchase, possess, cultivate
 - 30g
 - 4 plants
 - Consumed in a private residence, including the outdoor space of a home/unit/balcony.
 - Not to consume in public places, workplaces or inside vehicles (subject to exemption)
 - When transporting in a vehicle or boat, cannabis must be fastened closed and not readily available
 - No limit to the amount of cannabis that can be possess in the home

2017 Community Satisfaction Survey*

- **Community Safety** – 98.5% felt “very safe” or safe”
- **Local Problem Solving** – 96.1% felt “very satisfied” or “satisfied”
- **Ease of Contact** – 81 respondents had police contact in the past year. 97.5% said they were “very satisfied” or “satisfied”
- **Visibility** – 92.7% felt “very satisfied” or “satisfied” in their community
- **Community Involvement** – 89.2% said the OPP were “very involved” or “somewhat involved” in their community
- **Feeling of Safety** – 98.5% felt “very safe” or “safe” in their community
- **Effectiveness** -
 - 85.% were “very satisfied” or “satisfied” with enforcement of aggressive driving laws
 - 91.7% were “very satisfied” or “satisfied” with enforcement of drunk driving laws
- **Overall Satisfaction: 96.9%** of respondents were “very satisfied” or “satisfied” with the quality of police service provided by the OPP

* Conducted by research company R.A. Malatest & Associates Ltd. Involved randomly selected telephone numbers to sample respondents at least 16 years of age and where no member of the house worked for the OPP

OPP service dog Maximus aided in the arrest of a Tecumseh man who allegedly stole a vehicle and was involved in a collision. (Essex County OPP)



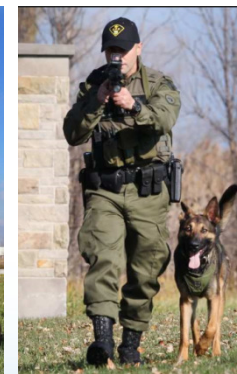
Maximus Making His Mark
