Crime:

- Reduce victimization from instances of sexual violence

- Address the proliferation of illegal grow operations

Traffic:



Other Policing Priorities:


- Develop transfer of care protocols with healthcare facilities
- Identify co-response solutions for non-police-related demands for service
















- An 2.0% decrease in Calls for Service June 2023 compared to June 2022

Property Crime⁵


- An **17.6% decrease** in Property Crime in June 2023 compared to June 2022. **Clearance Rate = 18.4%**

Motor Vehicle Collisions⁶



- An 8.4% decrease in MVCs June 2023 compared to June 2022
- 59 collisions (25.7%) were diverted to the Collision Reporting Centre in June 2023
- Year-to-date a 2.5% increase in MVCs in 2023 (1,307 collisions) compared to 2022 (1,340 collisions)






Administrative Drivers Licence Suspensions (ADLS)⁹






- A 42.9% increase in ADLS suspensions in June 2023 compared to June 2022


Drug Offences¹¹

- A 362.5% increase in Drug Offences in June 2023 compared to June 2022
- Year-to-date a 32.0% increase in Drug Offences in 2023 (99 incidents) compared to 2022 (75 incidents)
- A PJFCET warrant was executed on a South Talbot Road, Lakeshore address resulting in 11,657 plants, 104 lbs of bud and \$2,690 seized. With the assistance of CBSA, identities of the 5 individuals were confirmed. Each was charged with Cultivate Cannabis at a place that is not their residence, Possess Cannabis for the Purpose of Selling and Possession for the Purpose of Distributing. 2 males were then turned over to CBSA due to their status in the Country.



- A 1.1% decrease in Provincial Offences in June 2023 compared to June 2022
- An average of **17.3 tickets/day in June 2023** compared to 17.5 tickets/day in June 2022
- Year-to-date, a 32.7% increase in Provincial Offences in 2023 (3,659) compared to 2022 (2,756)




Traffic Enforcement¹³

	Two males from Windsor, aged 21 and 33, were arrested and charged with Fraud Over after an attempt to defraud a male using the Grandparent Scam. Officers on patrol intercepted the suspect vehicle. The suspect's vehicle was identified as having been involved in several other similar incidents throughout Essex County.
Lakeshore	A road rage incident on Highway 401 escalated when a vehicle passenger displayed a handgun, plainly visible, to the driver of a vehicle that passed on the right. The suspect vehicle then fled ahead and was observed exiting the highway at Manning Road. Patrol officers conducted a high-risk vehicle stop. Both occupants were removed and detained. A black firearm was located inside the vehicle and found to be a replica firearm. A further search of the vehicle resulted in the seizure of morphine and oxycodone pills. The males, both aged 22 were charged with Assault with a Weapon, Careless Use of a Firearm, Possession of a Prohibited Device for a Dangerous Purpose and Possession of a Schedule I Substance.
Kingsville	A resident of a long-term care home reported the loss of her cheque book in late February. Investigation revealed that between December and February, cheques had been written from her account totalling \$4,400 to an unknown person. Production Orders were obtained which ultimately identified the fraudster to be her PSW using an alias. A 36 yr. old female has been charged with Possession of Property Obtained by Crime x 3, Acts on Forged Document x3 and Fraud Under x3.
Leamington	CSCU members obtained warrants for 2 residences and a vehicle following a fentanyl and methamphetamine trafficking investigation. The subject of the investigation was arrested by ERT members leaving a stash house. Warrants were then executed on the stash house, his residence and his vehicle. A total of 9 found-ins were located, including children. A search of the residence recovered an extended magazine containing 29 rounds of ammunition and roughly \$5,000 in bulk currency. K9 was engaged and a loaded handgun was located along with fentanyl. In total, \$72,000 worth of fentanyl and cocaine were seized from all 3 locations. 4 people were charged with 47 offences including Unauthorized Possession of a Weapon, Possession of a Weapon for a Dangerous Purpose, Possession of Loaded Prohibited or Restricted Firearm, Careless Storage of a Firearm, Possess for the Purpose of Trafficking, and Fail to Comply with Undertaking.
Tecumseh	Officers responded to several traffic complaints regarding an erratic driver who had an interaction with Woodstock Police. The vehicle was noted to have stolen licence plates and smashed windows before it fled. Several attempts were made to stop the vehicle including blocks and tire deflation devices. Essex County officers located the vehicle abandoned on Highway 401 in Lakeshore and deployed K9 Maximus. A successful track resulted in a 25 yr. old male being located inside a shower stall of the Huskey truck stop. He was arrested and charged with Possession of a Schedule I Substance and Possession of Property Obtained by Crime Over. He was turned over to CBSA due to an immigration warrant.
Essex	A 27 yr. old male has been charged with Second Degree Murder after a 49 yr. old male died from a stab wound to the chest. The males had been drinking together and became involved in a physical dispute which escalated when a knife was obtained. Numerous support units engaged including Crime, ERT, Ident, and a Reconstructionist who utilized a drone to map the scene.
