#### **Detachment Focus and Priorities**

The OPP's action planning process ensures compliance with the Adequacy and Effectiveness of Police Services Regulation (Adequacy Standards) filed as O. Reg. 3/99 in 1999.

Through assessment, analysis and consultation, the following areas of focus were identified for the next three years (2020 – 2022) in Essex County:

#### Crime:

- Reduce victimization from instances of sexual violence
- Address & prevent property crime
- Address & prevent illicit drug crime
- Support victims of domestic abuse
- Address the proliferation of illegal grow operations

#### Traffic:

- Year-round focus on causal factors of motor vehicle collisions with a focus on (Big 4) Aggressive Driving, Impaired Driving, Distracted Driving and Use of Seatbelts
- Marine enforcement and security on local waterways
- Streamline collision reporting

#### Other Policing Priorities:

- Develop transfer of care protocols with healthcare facilities
- Identify co-response solutions for non-police-related demands for service










# <u>Calls for Service<sup>3</sup></u>



- An 11.8% increase in Calls for Service August 2023 compared to August 2022
- Year-to-date, an 6.6% increase in Calls for Service in 2023 (26,423) compared to 2022 (24,779).



- A 28.7% decrease in Violent Crime in August 2023 compared to August 2022. Clearance Rate = 71.8%
- Year-to-date a 6.3% increase in Violent Crime in 2023 (706 incidents) compared to 2022 (664 incidents)

## Property Crime<sup>5</sup>




- An 35.1% decrease in Property Crime in August 2023 compared to August 2022. Clearance Rate = 15.4%
- Year-to-date an 5.8% decrease in Property Crime in 2023 (2,022 incidents) compared to 2022 (2,147 incidents)

# Motor Vehicle Collisions<sup>6</sup>



- A 19.9% increase in MVCs August 2023 compared to August 2022
- 82 collisions (32.4%) were diverted to the Collision Reporting Centre in August 2023
- Year-to-date a 6.1% increase in MVCs in 2023 (1,819 collisions) compared to 2022 (1,715 collisions)







- A 23.1% increase in ADLS suspensions in August 2023 compared to August 2022


- A 42.9% decrease in Drug Offences in August 2023 compared to August 2022
- Year-to-date a 45.5% increase in Drug Offences in 2023 (144 incidents) compared to 2022 (99 incidents)
- A CSCU drug trafficking investigation resulted in a search warrant executed on a Lutsch Ave, Leamington apartment. Several Schedule I substances, currency and electronic devices were seized valued at \$3,600. The 58 yr. old male resident was charged with Trafficking x3. Both females were charged with Possession of a Schedule I Substance.




# <u>Provincial Offences</u> 12



- A **78.2% increase** in Provincial Offences in August 2023 compared to August 2022
- An average of 19.0 tickets/day in August 2023 compared to 10.7 tickets/day in August 2022
- Year-to-date, a 28.5% increase in Provincial Offences in 2023 (4,680) compared to 2022 (3,641)






• An average of **20.8 recorded vehicle stops per day** (644 stops) in August 2023 compared to the 2022 average of 18.7 stops/day.

# MHRU Calls for Service 14



- An 8.8% decrease in MHRU calls in August 2023 compared to August 2022
- Year-to-date a 12.1% decrease in MHRU calls in 2023 (949) compared to 2022 (1,080)
- Youth Crisis Response Team (YMCRT) responded to **27 calls** in August 2023 and 220 calls year-to-date.

## **Notable Investigations**

Lakeshore	The Major Crime Unit investigated a mischief in which balloons filled with engine oil were lobbed into a yard causing significant damage to the house and lawn. The homeowner suspected a family member based upon a longstanding dispute. The balloons were seized from the scene and DNA collected from the rim of a balloon. The DNA sample was sent to CFS for analysis and returned to a male profile not currently in the databank. A warrant was subsequently obtained for the 64 yr. old suspect male's DNA. In August, CFS confirmed the DNA collected from a balloon belonged to the male suspect. He was subsequently arrested and charged with Mischief Over \$5,000.  On officer on routine patrol conducted a traffic stop for "Unauthorized Use of Plates" under the Highway Traffic Act. The male driver provided verbal ID which the officer suspected was false. The officer reviewed
	the VIN on the vehicle and confirmed the driver to also be the registered owner. The 45 yr old driver was arrested after found to be breaching his curfew, his condition not to operate a motor vehicle and that he was not residing with his surety. A search of the vehicle located the male's ID and court documents as well as ID belonging to another male and counterfeit money. The male was charged with Obstruct Peace Officer, Fail to Comply with Release Order x3, Possess Break In Instruments, Possess Property Obtained by Crime, Possess Counterfeit Money and Possession of an Identity Document.
	In July and August, Essex County OPP investigated several residential B&Es and robberies in which a 39 yr. old female and 41 yr. old male were identified as persons of interest (POI). On August 19 <sup>th</sup> , officers responded to a B&E in progress in which an occupant was confronted by a male with ski mask and bladed object. The male was observed fleeing in a dark Dodge Caravan with a rear Michigan licence plate. A vehicle matching the description was located a short time later as it entered Highway 401 and was stopped. The driver and passenger were identified as the male and female POIs in other B&Es. The vehicle was towed for unauthorized use of plates (HTA).
	CSCU members conducted follow-up, locating a jewelry box from the B&E in the grassy area off 401 and confirming the MI licence plates had been stolen. Members conducted surveillance located the pair in the City of Windsor operating a different vehicle. Both were arrested and charged with Robbery with a Weapon and Possession of Property Obtained by Crime. The male was additionally charged with Disguise with Intent and Drive While Prohibited.
Kingsville	On August 24th, officers responded to a commercial B&E in which 6 high-end bicycles, parts and accessories valued at roughly \$10,000 were stolen. Information was obtained that assisted CSCU members with their investigation. A Tele-warrant to Search was obtained overnight and executed the following morning. Three occupants were located inside the apartment on Remark Drive, along with the stolen property and small quantity of methamphetamine. Two males and a female aged, 39, 52 and 34 respectively were arrested and charged with Possession of Property Obtained by Crime.
Leamington	Officers responded to a frantic 911 call indicating a male had a knife. Officers quickly evacuated the other residents and contained the home. After some time, the male was deescalated and walked out to police where he was apprehended under the MHA. A subsequent investigation by the Major Crime unit resulted in the 38 yr. old male being charged with Assault with a Weapon x2, Possession of a Weapon for a Dangerous Purpose and Fail to Comply with Probation Order. He was held in custody.
