Detachment Focus and Priorities

The OPP's action planning process ensures compliance with the Adequacy and Effectiveness of Police Services Regulation (Adequacy Standards) filed as O. Reg. 3/99 in 1999.

Through assessment, analysis and consultation, the following areas of focus were identified for the next three years (2020 – 2022) in Essex County:

Crime:

- Reduce victimization from instances of sexual violence.
- Address & prevent property crime.
- Address & prevent illicit drug crime.
- Support victims of domestic abuse.
- Address the proliferation of illegal grow operations.

Traffic:

- Year-round focus on causal factors of motor vehicle collisions with a focus on (Big 4) Aggressive. Driving, Impaired Driving, Distracted Driving and Use of Seatbelts.
- Marine enforcement and security on local waterways.
- Streamline collision reporting.

Other Policing Priorities:

- Develop transfer of care protocols with healthcare facilities.
- Identify co-response solutions for non-police-related demands for service.













<u>Calls for Service³</u>




- A 14.4% increase in Calls for Service in March 2024 compared to March 2023.




<u>Violent Crime</u>⁴

Property Crime⁵




- A 12.6% decrease in Property Crime in March 2024 compared to March 2023. Clearance Rate in 2024 = 21%.






Administrative Drivers Licence Suspensions (ADLS)⁹










- A 30% increase in Provincial Offences in March 2024 compared to March 2023.




<u>Traffic Enforcement</u> 13

Notable Investigations - Essex County OPP

1. In January 2024, members from the Essex County OPP Community Street Crime Unit began assisting the Niagara Regional Police Service with a drug overdose investigation. On the 21st of March 2024, members from the Niagara Regional Police Service, Essex County OPP Community Street Crime Unit and Essex County OPP ERT executed a search warrant at an address in Leamington. As a result of the warrant, police seized the following items: suspected MDMA and \$4,700.00 CAD. A Leamington resident was subsequently charged with the following offences: Trafficking – Oxycodone and Possession of Proceeds of Crime.



2. Throughout the month of March 2024, members from the Essex County OPP Community Street Crime Unit conducted an investigation in regards to a suspect trafficking drugs throughout Leamington. At the conclusion of the investigation, a search warrant was executed at a residence in Leamington which resulted in the seizure of the following items: Cocaine (valued at \$6,500.00), Psilocybin (valued at \$110.00), MDMA (valued at \$150.00), a cell phone and digital scales. Two Leamington residents were subsequently arrested and charged with Trafficking – Cocaine.



3. On the 27th of March 2024 just before 5:00am, members from the Lakeshore OPP Detachment were dispatched to a construction site in the area of the Water Pollution Control Plant for a break and enter in progress. Upon arrival, the suspect(s) had left the area and an investigation began. At the conclusion of the investigation, which



included witness interviews, reviewing video surveillance and the completion of a search warrant, two suspects were identified, arrested and subsequently charged with the following offences: Break and Enter, Possess Break in Instruments, Trafficking in Stolen Goods and Mischief.



4. On the 30th of March 2024 at approximately 4:30am, the complainants 2015 Cadillac ATS was stolen from the driveway of the residence in Kingsville. Officers from the Kingsville OPP Detachment, the Leamington OPP Detachment and the Community Street Crime Unit liaised with one another and the stolen vehicle was eventually located in Leamington with no one around. The OPP Ident unit processed the vehicle for evidence and the investigation is ongoing.
