## Detachment Focus and Priorities

The OPP's action planning process ensures compliance with the Adequacy and Effectiveness of Police Services Regulation (Adequacy Standards) filed as O. Reg. 3/99 in 1999.

Through assessment, analysis and consultation, the following areas of focus were identified for the next three years (2020 – 2022) in Essex County:

### Crime:

- Reduce victimization from instances of sexual violence.
- Address & prevent property crime.
- Address & prevent illicit drug crime.
- Support victims of domestic abuse.
- Address the proliferation of illegal grow operations.

### Traffic:

- Year-round focus on causal factors of motor vehicle collisions with a focus on (Big 4) Aggressive Driving, Impaired Driving, Distracted Driving and Use of Seatbelts.
- Marine enforcement and security on local waterways.
- Streamline collision reporting.


### Other Policing Priorities:

- Identify co-response solutions for non-police-related demands for service.




## Top Calls for Service <sup>1</sup>









## Calls for Service<sup>3</sup>




- An **3.4% increase** in Calls for Service in February 2024 compared to February 2023.
- Year-to-date, a **6.5% increase** in Calls for Service in 2024 (**6,419**) compared to 2023 (**6,026**).




## Violent Crime<sup>4</sup>



- A **0% increase** in Violent Crime in February 2024 compared to February 2023. **Clearance Rate in 2024 = 80%.**
- Year-to-date, a **1.2% decrease** in Violent Crime in 2024 (**163**) compared to 2023 (**165**).

## Property Crime<sup>5</sup>




- A **17.9% decrease** in Property Crime in February 2024 compared to February 2023. **Clearance Rate in 2024 = 23%.**
- Year-to-date, a **7.8% decrease** in Property Crime in 2024 (**389**) compared to 2023 (**422**).

## Motor Vehicle Collisions<sup>6</sup>



- A **1.6% increase** in MVCs in February 2024 compared to February 2023.
- **74 collisions (40%)** were diverted to the Collision Reporting Centre in February 2024.
- Year-to-date, a **26% increase** in MVCs in 2024 (**513**) compared to 2023 (**407**).




## Administrative Drivers Licence Suspensions (ADLS)<sup>9</sup>




- An **29% decrease** in ADLS suspensions in February 2024 compared to February 2023.






## Provincial Offences<sup>12</sup>

## Traffic Enforcement<sup>13</sup>




- An average of **35.8 recorded vehicle stops/day** in February 2024.

## MHRU Calls for Service<sup>14</sup>



- A **39.6% decrease** in MHRU calls in February 2024 compared to February 2023.
- Year-to-date, an **33% decrease** in MHRU calls in 2024 (**157**) compared to 2023 (**234**).
- Youth Crisis Response Team (YMCRT) responded to **42 calls** in February 2024 and **77 calls** year-to-date.

## Notable Investigations – Essex County OPP

1. On the 6<sup>th</sup> of February 2024 at 8:27am, officers from the Lakeshore OPP Detachment were dispatched to an address in the community of Lighthouse Cove for a report of a robbery. With the assistance of West Region OPP Emergency Response Team, the Tactics and Rescue Unit, Canine Unit and Aviation Services, a suspect was located in the Municipality of Chatham-Kent and arrested. A male was later charged with multiple offences, including: Robbery with a Weapon (X6), Theft of Motor Vehicle (X2), Dangerous Operation of a Motor Vehicle (X2), Disguise with Intent (X3), Failure to Stop at an Accident, Flight from Police, Possession of an Imitation Weapon, etc.
2. On the 20<sup>th</sup> of February 2024 at approximately 6:40pm, officers from the Leamington OPP Detachment were dispatched to an address on Russell Street in Leamington for an assault investigation. Upon arrival, officers located a male who had what appeared to be stab wounds. The male was transported to hospital with serious injuries. Through a thorough investigation, a 17 year old male suspect was identified, located and arrested. The male was later charged with multiple offences, including: Attempt to Commit Murder, Failure to Comply with Release Order and Possession of a Schedule 1 Substance for the Purpose of Trafficking – Opioid.
3. Between the 21<sup>st</sup> of May 2023 and the 22<sup>nd</sup> of February 2024, there were multiple residences broken into in the Tecumseh and Lakeshore area. At the conclusion of a thorough investigation, a male suspect was identified and is currently charged with multiple offences, including: Robbery with Violence, Break and Enter a Dwelling House, Possession of Break in Instruments and Possession of Property Obtained by Crime Over \$5000.00.
4. On the 24<sup>th</sup> of February 2024 at approximately 5:45pm, officers from the Leamington OPP Detachment were dispatched to an address on Talbot Street West in Leamington for a report of a home invasion. Upon arrival, it was determined that three individuals attended the residence and forcibly gained entry. Once inside, two occupants were assaulted by the suspects who proceeded to steal multiple items from the residence prior to fleeing the scene. The investigation remains ongoing.
