#### Traffic:


- A focus on education and enforcement, to change high-risk driving behaviours, including aggressive driving, impaired driving, distracted driving and the non-use of seatbelts.

#### Other Policing Priorities:


- Continue to support the Community Safety and Well-Being Plan for Windsor-Essex.









### Calls for Service<sup>4</sup>




- An **9.5% increase** in Calls for Service in October 2024 compared to October 2023.




# Violent Crime<sup>5</sup>

## Property Crime<sup>6</sup>




A 18.8% increase in Property Crime in October 2024 compared to October 2023. Clearance Rate in 2024 = 21.96%.






### Administrative Drivers Licence Suspensions (ADLS)<sup>10</sup>






- An **34% decrease** in ADLS suspensions in October 2024 compared to October 2023.






# <u>Provincial Offences</u> 13

## Traffic Enforcement 14






# MCRT Calls for Service 15

### Notable Investigations – Essex County OPP

1. In late September 2024, members from the OPP Community Street Crime Unit began an investigation into a male party believed to be trafficking cocaine in the Leamington area. As a result, a search warrant for a residence in Leamington was applied for and later granted. Members from the OPP Community Street Crime Unit, with the assistance of an RCMP canine officer executed the search warrant and located the following items: a kilogram of Cocaine in brick form, other packaged Cocaine, four digital scales, one cellphone, drug packaging material, brass knuckles, a BB gun, knives, Canadian and International currency, luxury watches, etc. As a result, a male party was arrested and charged with multiple offences, including: Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking – Cocaine, Unauthorized Possession of a Weapon, Possession of Firearm or Ammunition contrary to Probation Order, Fail to Comply with Probation Order and Possession of an Identity Document and Possession of Proceeds of Crime Obtained by Crime Over \$5,000.



- 2. On the 14<sup>th</sup> of October 2024, the complainants 2022 Toyota Venza was stolen from an address in Lakeshore. As a result, members from the OPP Community Street Crime Unit liaised with Toyota and the stolen vehicle, valued at approximately \$45,000.00, was located and recovered in Windsor. The suspect has yet to be identified and the investigation continues.
- 3. On the 28th of October 2024, members from the Lakeshore OPP Detachment were alerted to a possible stolen vehicle in the area of Lakeshore Road 211 in Lakeshore. As a result of a police investigation, consent was provided to search a property in the area and multiple stolen vehicles were located. A further search revealed several other items which were seized by police, which included: a loaded handgun, Canadian currency, motorcycles and suspected methamphetamine. An estimated value of the items recovered is approximately \$294,000.00. A male party was subsequently arrested and charged with multiple offences,



including: Possession of Property Obtained by Crime Over \$5,000, Possession of Property Obtained by Crime Under \$5,000, Possession of Firearm or Ammo Contrary to Prohibition Order, Failure to Comply with Probation Order, Careless Storage of Firearm and Ammo, Unauthorized Possession of a Restricted Firearm and Possession of loaded Restricted Firearm and Use of Stolen Credit Card.
